A strong endowment fund broadens educational opportunities, truly helping all communities we touch to 'grow beyond.'"

Gifts made to the endowment fund make an impact now and in the future. The endowment principal is never spent, creating financial stability and allowing LLCC to be less dependent on unpredictable revenue sources. The fund's earnings are used for the greatest needs of the college, including scholarships, curriculum, programs, supportive activities and even capital construction in some instances.

Dennis Shackelford, LLCC trustee, endorsed the campaign. "Dollars raised by the campaign support our mission in the most targeted way possible - directly impacting students through scholarships, classroom upgrades, program enhancements and more."

Greg Lutchka, chair of the LLCC Foundation Board of Directors, is an LLCC alum. "I am passionate about supporting 'Grow Beyond' because it is first and foremost about students. A strong endowment fund is one of the most important initiatives we can undertake for the future health of the college and its students."

The annual earnings from the endowment fund provide vital financial resources for:

- Scholarships - tuition, fees, books and emergency needs for direct student support, like grocery and gas cards, bus passes and tools for students in a variety of programs.
- Instructional excellence and achievement - state-of-the-art teaching environments for nursing, surgical technology and other programs; DVDs and software to help develop curriculum; iPads, computers and more.
- Programs and supporting activities - development of new programs and supporting curricula responsive to community needs.

A campaign web site has been established at www.growbeyond-llcc.org for online giving opportunities. The campaign is expected to run through May 2017 and culminate with the college's 50th anniversary celebration.

Another alum truly making a difference

Karla Carwile says her “passion for the poor” was fostered while a student at LLCC in the late 80s and early 90s. Now, as president of OnePatient Global Health Initiative, she’s turned a passion into a career, and beyond.



Carwile, a clinical therapist completing a Ph.D. in psychology, and her partner, Dr. Daniel Ivankovich, an orthopedic surgeon, co-founded the not-for-profit OnePatient to provide health care in disparate areas of Chicago as well as marginalized and devastated areas internationally. She tells the story best herself. “We are committed to creating awareness of the difficulties that many under-served patients face when trying to seek the medical and psychological care necessary for health and wellness. But, we are also committed to supporting a patient accountability model with a pay-it-forward philosophy. Many times my compensation is simply telling a patient to go out and to pay-it-forward to someone else.”

Karla credits the passion that faculty like Virgil Rhodes, Art Meyer and Patricia Giacommini passed on as the seed that allowed her to bring her dream of helping others to reality. “The way these teachers pushed acts of kindness drove me to soup kitchens, Hope School, significantly disabled populations, social service agencies and more. My interest then made it a career.”

Karla says she and Daniel were both called to care. “It’s my hope that the youth and leaders of our communities will understand the continued importance of not just service learning, but service action. I don’t think you can truly understand what it means to come from a background where your life is so deeply impacted by others and have the need for service become as important as the very breath you take. My time at LLCC made this a reality.”

2014-2015 scholarship application available next month

The application period for LLCC Foundation scholarships for the 2014-2015 academic year opens Monday, December 2, 2013.

Scholarships are available for both first-time and continuing students who are or will be enrolled full or part-time at LLCC. Most scholarships have a stated grade point average and a minimum number of LLCC credit hours that must be completed each semester.

There is one application for all scholarships. Students submitting a complete application are considered for all available scholarships for which they are eligible.

A majority of LLCC Foundation scholarships are open to students in any program of study. There are also scholarships for students studying accounting, agriculture, architecture, art, automotive technology, aviation management, business, education, music, fire science, foreign language, health care, hospitality management, culinary arts, law enforcement and criminal justice, nursing, pre-law, pre-vet, psychology and more.

The application will be available online at www.llccfoundation.org. Students may also pick up a hard copy of the application in the LLCC Foundation, located on the Springfield campus in Menard Hall.
